### Dream Job – Actor 梦想职业- 演员

Helen: If you didn't have to work to make a living...

Oliver: 如果你不用为了挣钱, 你还会做你现在的工作吗?

Helen: Then what would you like to do? What would you fancy doing to make a living?

Oliver: 那么你会选择什么做为你的职业呢?

Helen: If money wasn't a problem, family responsibilities or education, if you could set all that to one side.

Oliver: Is that possible? 不用考虑钱, 不用负责养家, 所有的事情都不用考虑。

Helen: Then what would you really like to do?

Oliver: 那么我真的希望做什么呢? 得让我好好想想...

Helen: We all dream from time to time about giving up our day job.

Oliver: A day job 普通工作, 正常班, 很多人都会梦想能够做一些和他们生活不一样的事情, 比如他们梦想的工作。

Helen: A dream job. What would you really like to do for a job? The BBC asked people of all ages, colours and backgrounds to tell us their answers to this question.

Oliver: 我们能够听到一些非常有意思的回答。

Helen: But what is the nation's favourite dream job?

Oliver: 答案可能会有点儿出乎你的意料。

Helen: We'll be hearing expert views about why so many people think that acting is the perfect job for them.

Helen: Ruth used an interesting expression, a breed unto ourselves.

Helen: Hello, welcome to BBC Learning English. Today we are talking about the top choice for our dream jobs.

Oliver: 通过对其它人的深度研究和学习，演员在舞台上模仿和再现这些人的行为。

Helen: Young actresses Jessica Stevenson and Kacey Ainsworth share their views on acting with us.

Oliver: 这就是毅力 stamina 和专注 focus.

Helen: Jessica talks about staying in focus and keeping the physical stamina with you.

Oliver: 两脚同时起步跳跃, to jump in with both feet 意思就是全身投入, 不要考虑其他后果。

Helen: You also need to be brave and try to make yourself stand out.

Oliver: 显的出你自己 stand out. 看来, 表演不是一件容易的事情。

Helen: No I don't think so.

Oliver: 接下来让我们转到另一个话题, 看看一些和演员有非常亲密的工作关系的, 而且可以给演员工作的人。

Helen: If an actor wants to get some work, then he or she must have an agent.

Oliver: That's right. 经济人 agent 是能否给你工作面试的关键。

Helen: And here is Barry Burnett, agent to some very well known TV stars in the UK. What could he do for someone new to the business?

### Insert

Oliver: Barry 说照片是非常非常重要的。

Helen: Good photographs are tools of the trade.

Oliver: Tools 工具, 手段, trade 交易 (生意), tools of the trade 这个表达的意思是指一份工作的基本要素。

Helen: Barry has contacts in the business so if he hears of a job that is suitable for someone on his books, then he would send off their photos to the casting director.

Oliver: 选角导演 casting director, 他们是权利非常大的人, 因为他们可以给演员工作机会。

Helen: Barry would try to get the casting director interested in the actor.

Oliver: 说服选角导演,

Helen: To persuade someone.

Oliver: 帮演员得到面试的机会。

*First of all I would make sure that you have the right photographs. Photographs are very important tools of the trade. I mean if a part comes up, if I receive a part that I think you would be right for, and I've got the right photograph, I'll send it off and hopefully persuade the casting director to meet you for this particular part.*

Oliver: 这种竞争是非常艰苦和激烈的, 而且演员要努力表现以确保让选角导演注意到自己。

Oliver: 做为一个演员, 你必须做好失业的心理准备。

Helen: You hear it all the time about struggling actors unable to find acting jobs and then having to do other jobs to make ends meet.

Oliver: To make ends meet, 这是个俗语, 意思是养家糊口, 生活艰苦. 只有很少的演员能够仅仅通过表演维持生计。

Helen: Even for someone like Dan, he has to read scripts at auditions and immerse himself in the roles.

Oliver: Immerse 投入, 融入到角色当中, immerse yourself in something.

Helen: And in the auditions, Dan has to communicate passion in the script to the casting director.

Oliver: 在面试的时候, Dan 必须表现自己的激情, 可是一旦离开那个房间, 他必须马上把那个角色忘的干干净净。

Helen: I think that's because actors do so many auditions and have to be so many different characters, if they can't forget about roles, then it would make their own lives very difficult.

*Otherwise it'll eat you up, because more often than not, you don't get the job, and that's something you'll have to live with as well, is living with pretty regular rejection.*

Oliver: **Rejection** 拒绝,而且这种拒绝很正常, 很经常, 不过我还是觉得这是难以接受的。

Helen: That's what Dan means, that you have to forget about the role as soon as you leave the audition room, otherwise the rejection will eat you up as he puts it.

Oliver: 另一个俗语, **to eat somebody up** 就是说不能忘记什么事情, 通常是不愉快的经历, 是一种精神折磨。

Helen: Let's hear from Dan again.

But at its worst it's frustrating and disappointing and there can be some really hard times – but the highs are very high and the lows are very low.*

Oliver: 他说除了表演, 他想不出自己还有什么事情想做。

Helen: The rewarding part of the job is being able to entertain people.

Oliver: 作为演员, 你可以娱乐观众, 让他们高兴或悲伤。

Helen: Some times like a magician.

Oliver: 就像象魔术师一样。

Helen: Of course, the downside of acting is that there are hard times too. Then you could feel very frustrated and disappointed.

**Oliver:** Frustrated 失败, disappointed 失望.

**Helen:** The highs are very high, look at Hollywood film stars.

**Oliver:** 精彩的地方就非常精彩, 象 Julia Roberts, Brad Pitt, 他们是众人羡慕的对象。

**Helen:** But the lows are very low.

**Oliver:** 艰辛的地方也是很难接受的。

**Helen:** It's been fascinating to hear from actors about why they love their jobs so much.

**Oliver:** 我们也听到了什么是成为一个好演员的关键。

**Helen:** We'll be hearing what other top dream jobs people would like to do in the UK, so do join us again soon.

**Oliver:** Take care, 下次节目再见。
